Stormwater system cleanout is completed:

WOW Internet has removed their pipe from our storm water pipe in front of 1111 Chatham and repaired the street. The board is compiling a list and obtaining quotes to correct the issues found.

Below is an example of issues found. This pipe contains pool grout or stucco that was dumped into a storm drain.

It is illegal to dump anything into storm drains in Pinellas County. The Pinellas County Code of Ordinances, Article VI, Stormwater and Surface W ater Pollution, Section 58, prohibits any direct or indirect connection to the storm drainage system that results in a water quality violation. This includes the dumping of waste, chemicals, oil, sewage, trash, and yard waste into the storm drainage system. Violators may face fines up to \$10,000 per day, and payment for cleanup costs may be required. It is essential to adhere to these regulations to protect the water quality and natural habit ats of the area.

Huntington Trails Parking Regulations

- 1. Car and personal transportation trucks are permitted to park on our streets.
- No commercial trucks are permitted except while making deliveries or providing service to a home. No boats or RV's can be parked outside on the street or driveway for longer than 72 hours within a 30 day time frame.
- 3. **Do not park at the ends of cul-da-sacs or adjacent to landscape islands**. Service vehicles like Fire Trucks, ambulances and trash truck cannot navigate in these narrow road locations if there are parked vehicles.
- 4. Vehicles are only permitted to **park on one side of the street**. It does not matter which side of the street a vehicle is parked. However, once a vehicle is parked on one side, all others are to be parked on the same side. This is critical if a rescue vehicle needs to get to your home.
- 5. **Do NOT park across sidewalks** blocking clear pedestrian access. Please park vehicles in the garage, pull further up on the drive or park in the street.
